Baptists Together Mission Forum – June 2024

The Mission Forum gathered at Yarnfield Conference Centre in Staffordshire last month. After welcoming new members, and thinking about each person's identity and missional calling, three main items engaged the Forum in conversation, careful listening and discernment over the course of the meeting - Project Violet, Migration and Baptist Assembly. Project Violet - findings

The findings of **Project Violet** were released on 2 May, and many people began to engage with them at the launch webinar and at Assembly later in the month. This major research project has sought to understand more fully the theological, missional, and structural obstacles women ministers face in the Baptist community in England and Wales and identify ways forward. The **reports from each of the co-researchers** involved in the Project are available to download from our website, along with helpful graphic recordings which highlight key aspects of each report. In addition, have a look at the **Local Church Report** and the **'requests for change'** across all aspects of Baptist life - are there conversations you could have in your church to address some of the findings? **The deadline for responding to the findings is 30 September.**

Disability Awareness Sunday

There are many barriers disabled people can face on their journey to join, or be fully included, in church fellowships. Accessibility of church buildings isn't the only barrier for disabled people – there are lots of invisible barriers too, such as challenges fitting in socially and feeling you belong emotionally. Disability charity Through the Roof is inviting churches to celebrate Disability Awareness Week by including local disabled people and holding a service on Sunday 22 September 2024, or a day of their choice. Proximity

Proximity is a brand-new, free resource hub from The Message Trust, for urban missionaries. It's packed with resources, videos, advice, teaching, podcasts and much more covering all areas of mission. 
Sam Sharpe Lecture - Thursday 24 October
